These publication supplements AFI 36-2923, 25 May 2004, and IC 2004-1, 25 May 2004, govern the award of the Missile Badge to AFSC 2W1X1 personnel within Pacific Air Forces (PACAF). This supplement adds policy and procedures from which to determine eligibility for award of the Basic, Senior, and Master Missile Badge to PACAF AFSC 2W1X1 personnel in the grades E-1 through E-9. This publication applies to all PACAF organizations, and may not be supplemented by lower organizational elements. This publication does not apply to the Air National Guard (ANG) and the Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) and their units.

**AFI 36-2923, 25 May 2004, is supplemented as follows:**

5.3. AFSC 2W1X1 personnel wear the senior badge after 60 months of qualifying duties and award of 7-skill level; and the master badge as an E-7 and above with 144 months of qualifying duties.

7.2. Weapon Sections Chiefs, Armament Flight Chiefs, and Wing Weapon Managers are responsible for determining whether or not members under their supervision who have not yet been awarded the Missile Badge (Basic, Senior, or Master) meet the requirements in paragraphs 5 and 7. Use EPRs, award/ decoration narratives, record reviews, etc to determine award eligibility. Only time served performing the following duties will be credited toward award eligibility for 2W1X1 personnel: Wing Weapons Manager, weapons section chief and assistants, armament flight chief and assistants, weapons standardization superintendent, weapons safety, quality assurance, loading standardization crew member, squadron lead crew member, weapons academics instructor, weapons expeditor, weapons load crew member, weapons maintenance crew member, CAST chief, and armament technician. Additionally, members assigned to test and evaluation units, Numbered Air Force and MAJCOM headquarters positions which support guided missiles and guided missile systems are credited time for award. Members must have held the duty title, not simply have been assigned a 2W1X1 position number. Any other duties not directly associated with guided missiles or guided missile systems will not be given credit toward award of any missile badge. For members in grades E-1 through E-6, conduct a records review and document who performed

the review, and the date the award was approved in the member's AF Form 623a. For members in grades E-7 through E-9, conduct a records review and document who performed the review, and the date the award was approved on a Memorandum For Record (MFR). Place the MFR in the member's Personnel Information File.
